### PROTECTION, PARTICIPATION AND ADVOCACY

We implement actions within the protection system of the CA countries to guarantee the rights, participation and protection of children.

**6,659,950** children, adolescents and young people benefited from protection measures and public policy advocacy in Central America.

**140,318** fathers, mothers, caregivers, teachers, nurses, doctors, community leaders, faith leaders participating in training for child protection and tenderness.



### EDUCATION

We strengthen technical literacy skills in preschool and primary education. We strengthen the technical vocational skills of adolescents and young people.

**171,948** primary school children, positively impacted, supported by teaching materials to strengthen their skills and knowledge.

**147,059** children and adolescents benefited through life skills, leadership, entrepreneurship.

Our Area Programs are closely related to **CLIMATE CHANGE**. For this reason, we have presence in **27 departments of the Central American Dry Corridor**, with **128,252 sponsored children** (66% of all sponsored children) in **44 Area Programs**.



## HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Our priority at all times is to respond to emergency situations. We guarantee safe spaces, prevent and protect children and their families.

**2,643,159** people assisted during COVID-19 in CA.

**69,132** people assisted after hurricane Julia in CA.

**US\$ 272,469** in the hurricane Julia emergency.

**US\$ 5,959,250** investment during COVID-19.



## WASH

We provide safe water and adequate sanitation to children and their families. We promote local development through capacity building of advocates, leaders and the wider community.

**35,364** children with access to water and sanitation in different schools.

**124,044** people have received hygiene and sanitation education.

**179,684** people benefited with latrines, wells, water systems and/or sinks constructed, installed and/or rehabilitated.



## FOOD SECURITY AND NUTRITION

We contribute to improving the availability and accessibility of food in the most vulnerable households, responding to one of the main causes of migration in the Central American region.

**311,759** People supported in food security with food packages or Food Vouchers.

**\$2,204,970** Amount invested in food security (cash voucher, food vouchers).

**91,193** people were sensitized to nutritional care and food.



## DONORS & PARTNERS

In addition to our areas of work, we have an impact on other issues through Grants, multi-lateral, institutional and private funds, with topics such as research in education, sexual and reproductive health, prevention of gender violence, climate change, HIV, tuberculosis, among others. In 2022, WV in Central America earned and managed more than **US\$ 48 million** in grants from various donors.
